POST-ELECTION LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT TRAINING PROGRAM

The Naut'sa mawt Tribal Council (NmTC) is pleased to advise you that you are invited to participate in the two-day NmTC Post-Election Leadership Development Workshop that will be delivered at the Songhees Wellness Centre on February 8 & 9, 2017. This is part two of a two-part program.

Travel and accommodations costs are supported by NmTC with eligible travel claims that will be reimbursed in accordance with NmTC policy.

Background

This workshop and the Pre—Election Leadership Development Workshop, developed with the support of Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) and the New Relationship Trust, is a long-standing goal of the NmTC Board to support leadership capacity development and good governance throughout the NmTC Nations. To meet this goal, the NmTC undertook research with existing NmTC Member Nation leaders to identify training priorities for current and future leaders at the (a) pre-election stage, and the (b) post-election stage. The findings from this research were the basis of the two respective courses.

First Workshop

The Pre-Election Leadership Development Workshop, was piloted on December 1, 2016 at the NmTC AGM and received high rates of satisfaction from participants. This second workshop will similarly be a chance for existing leadership to test and refine the training, film the workshop for the development of the on-line blended model delivery, and form the basis of the future on-line delivery. The intent of this blended model for workshop delivery is to: maximize the flexibility of program delivery for learners, and allow for multiple entry/exit points that support the retention of learners and long-term course completion.

Workshop Details

Two members from each NmTC Member Nation, the NmTC Elders Council, and 3-5 Youth will be nominated by the NmTC Project Team and NmTC Board to participate. This fast paced workshop will be delivered over two days. You will be provided a workbook and will participate in small group work that will support future learners. You will also be asked to sign a film release form that will allow us to use your image as part of the on-line future delivery of the training. Finally, you may be asked to complete an interview regarding the workshop.

Future Delivery

The final version of the on-line workshop will be delivered on-line over 10 hours, with the workbook being a resource that is regularly used and shared by the learners. Future on-line learners will be encouraged to participate in Member Nation leadership meetings, identify and work with a senior leader mentor, Elders, or NmTC Advisor to support learning, and undertake journaling to reflect upon learnings and how to improve their leadership. If a learner participates in the workshop and completes the journaling assignment they may apply through NmTC to receive credits (3) for their training that can be utilized to build a transcript within the BC post-secondary system.
